Managing?

- Maintaining the fridge
 - Planned Preventive Maintenance
 - Fault finding and repair
- Controlling the stock
 - Daily (almost) stock checks
 - ‘Flying squad’ emergency O Negs
- Devolving responsibility
 - Local responsibility
 - Fault reporting
 - Local stock control

Satellite and remote blood fridges?

- St James's, Leeds
 - Currently 8 blood fridges (soon to be 10)
- Leeds General Infirmary
 - Currently 13 blood fridges

These are in addition to the main laboratory banks

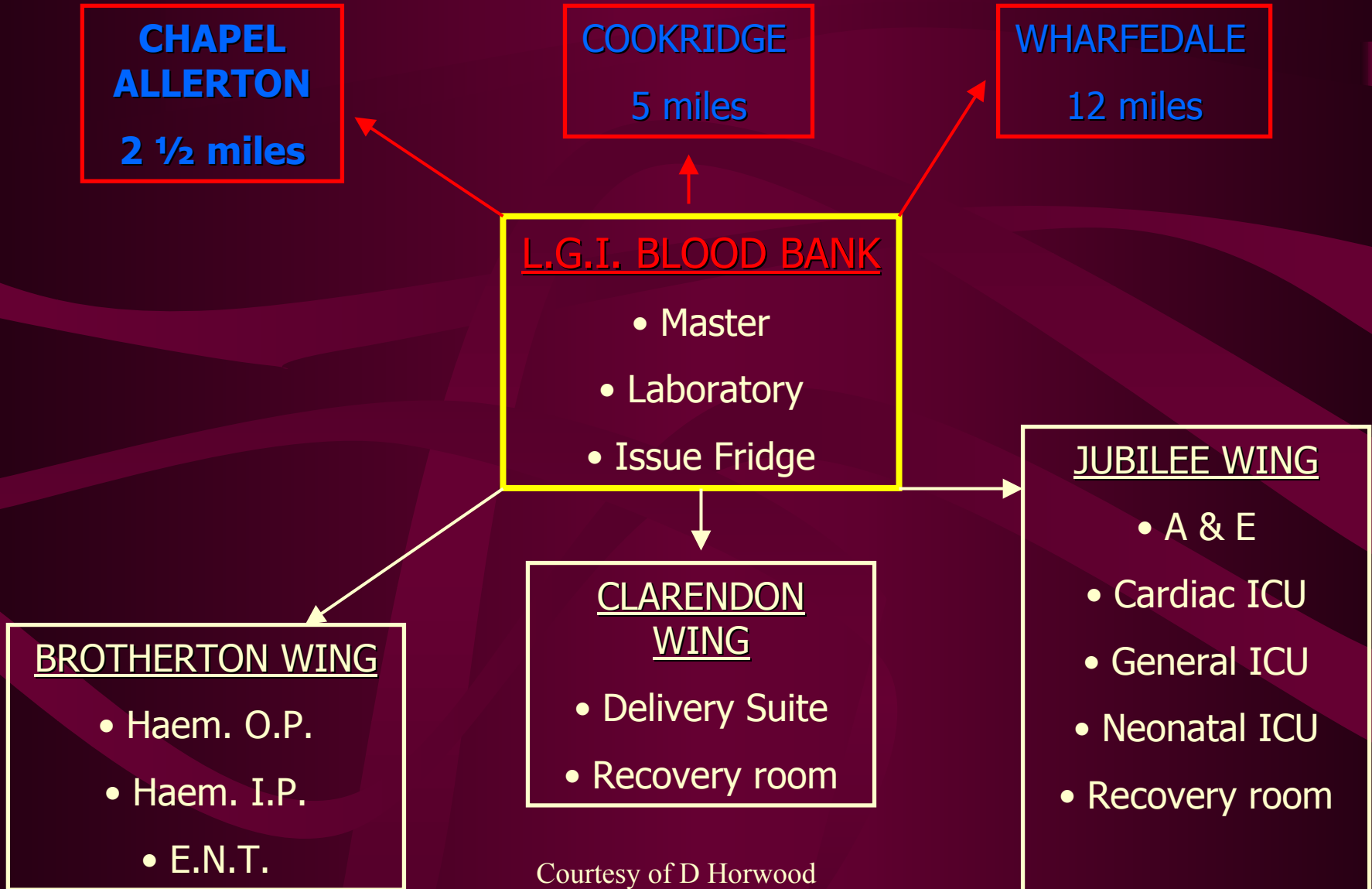
All monitored electronically

- Access control
 - Bar coded badge
 - Magnetic locks
 - Central monitoring
- Alarms
 - Central alarm panel
 - Clear instructions
- Stock control
 - Individual records of removal and replacement

Stock control

- Visit every day to each bank on site by MLA (Monday to Friday)
- Visit to remote banks 3 days per week
- All stock checked
- All stock inventories audited weekly
- All bank alarms tested
- All charts & displays checked
