The BSMS Open Meeting 2006 will take place on 7 June 2006 at Paragon Hotel, Birmingham

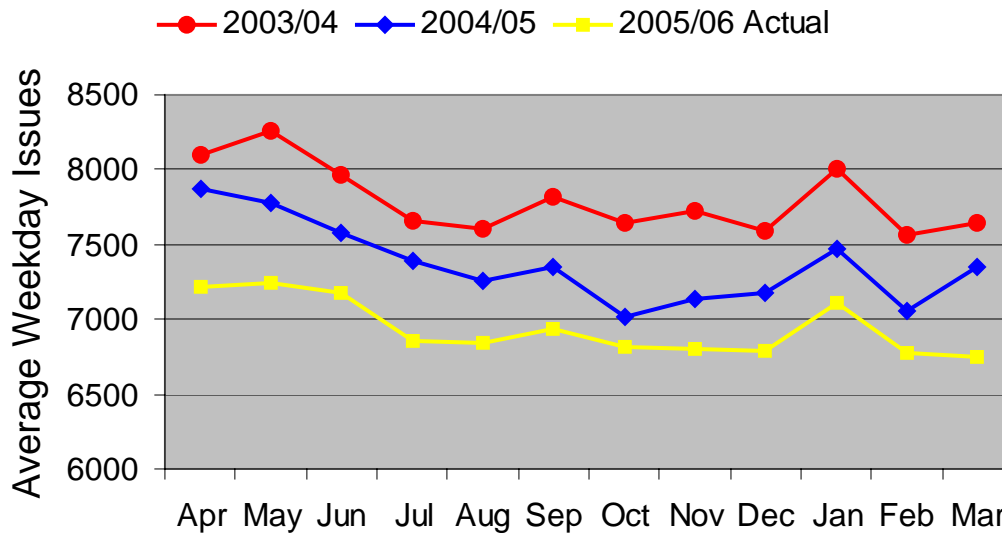

RED CELL DEMAND 2005-06



During 2005-06 the demand for red cells continued to fall, although at not such a fast rate as in the previous two years. Total red cell issues for 2005-06 were 1.941M, **4.4% below** 2004-05 issues of 1.93M. Group O Neg issues were 203,718, **1.7% below** the 2004-05 issues of 207,262. Red cell issues for the first six weeks of 2006-07 are higher than expected, this may be due to a declining impact of appropriate use initiatives.
